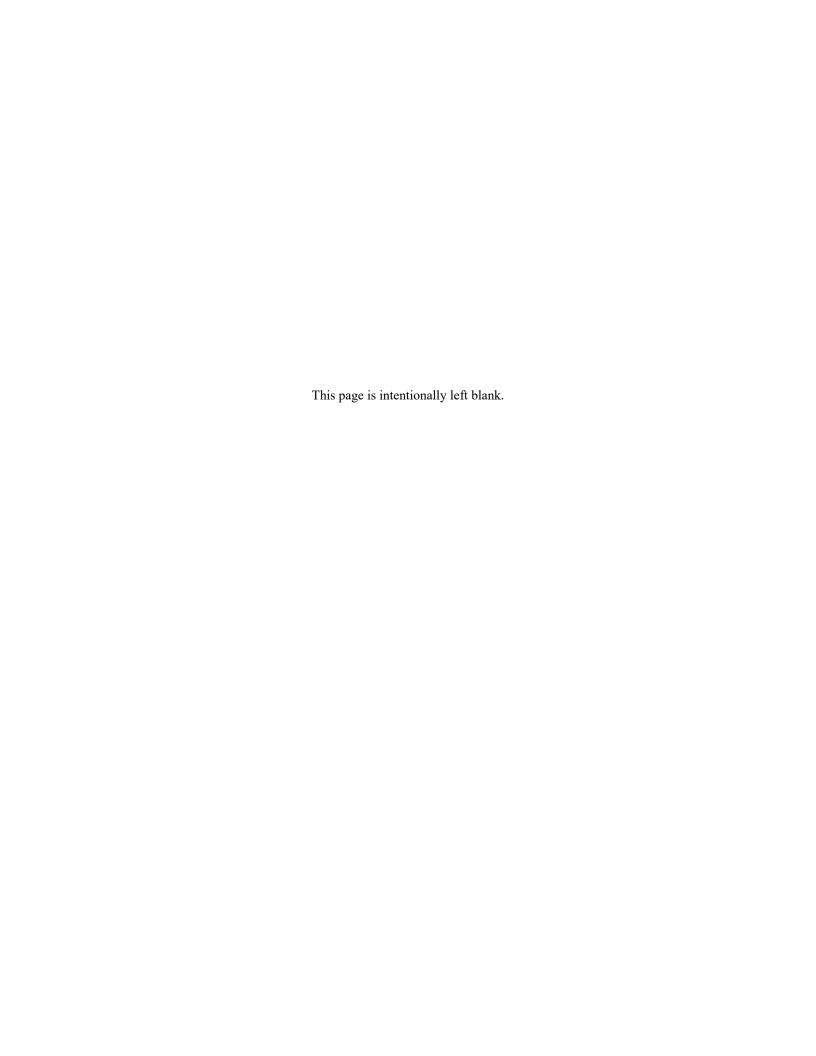

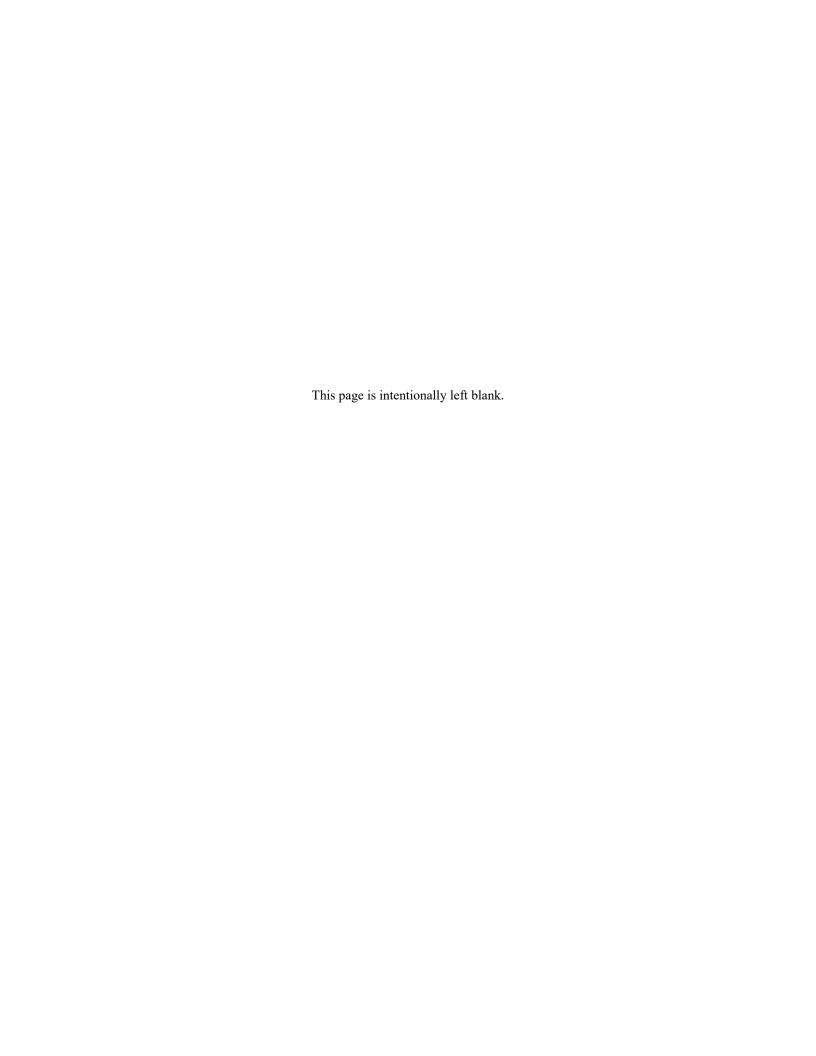

#### Introduction

The Community Service Employment for Older Americans (CSEOA) program, also known as the Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP), supports the self-sufficiency and employment of older workers by providing part-time, paid community service positions and work-based training for unemployed, low-income individuals, age 55 or older.

SCSEP, as authorized by Title V of the Older Americans Act (OAA), has a dual purpose "to foster individual economic self-sufficiency and to increase the number of participants placed in unsubsidized employment in the public and private sectors, while maintaining the community service focus of the program." The OAA was amended by the Older Americans Act Reauthorization Act of 2016 (2016 OAA).

In FY 2019, SCSEP grantees included 56 units of state and territorial government and 19 competitively-selected national grantees. SCSEP-funded services are available in nearly all 3,000 U.S. counties and territories.

The FY 2021 Budget proposes to eliminate SCSEP.

#### **Funding Mechanism**

The SCSEP program operates on a Program Year (PY) basis (July 1 to June 30) and SCSEP funds are distributed by a statutorily prescribed formula. In general, the formula allocates funds to every state, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico, based on U.S. Census data on the number of individuals in that jurisdiction who have low income and are 55 and older. Under current law, prior to determining the amount available to be allocated to the states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico, funds are reserved for the following: 1) up to 1.5 percent of the total authorization as determined by the Secretary of Labor for pilots, demonstrations, and evaluation projects; 2) a fixed percentage of 0.75 percent of the total allocation to the territories of Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; and 3) a portion determined by the Secretary of Labor for national public or non-profit agencies to serve eligible American Indian and Pacific Island/Asian American individuals.

After the reserved amounts are specified and the funding proportion for each state is determined by the formula, funds are allocated to and administered through grants to all state governors, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia, and four territories, as well as national non-profit agencies. Approximately 22-percent of formula funds are awarded to the governors, with 78 percent competitively awarded to national non-profit agencies for services across the country. Under the OAA, these grants are renewed annually for four years, with an optional one-year extension.

#### FY 2021

The FY 2021 Budget requests no funds for this program. SCSEP has a goal of transitioning half of participants into unsubsidized employment within the first quarter after exiting the program, but has struggled to achieve even this modest goal. Further, these placement rates exclude the nearly one-half of program participants who do not complete the program and are excluded from the measure. The goal of supporting the self-sufficiency and employment of older workers will be addressed through Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) programs.

#### **FY 2020**

In FY 2020, \$405,000,000 was appropriated for Program Year (PY) 2020, which covers the period of April 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021. Seventy-five grantees are providing low-income seniors with subsidized work experience in community service employment assignments. The Department anticipates that SCSEP will serve approximately 56,050 participants in PY 2020. SCSEP remains a mandatory partner with American Job Centers and, pursuant to WIOA, SCSEP grantees must carry out the responsibilities of one-stop partner programs, such as coordinating and aligning programs to better serve job seekers and businesses.

#### FY 2019

In FY 2019, \$400,000,000 was appropriated for PY 2019, which covers the period of April 1, 2019, through June 30, 2020. Seventy-five grantees are providing low-income seniors with

subsidized work experience in community service employment assignments. The Department anticipates that SCSEP will serve approximately 55,353 participants in PY 2019. SCSEP remains a mandatory partner with American Job Centers and, pursuant to WIOA, SCSEP grantees must carry out the responsibilities of one-stop partner programs, such as coordinating and aligning programs to better serve job seekers and businesses.

#### **Workload and Performance Narrative**

The OAA Reauthorization Act of 2016 more closely aligned SCSEP performance indicators to those of WIOA. SCSEP grantees will report on these measures beginning in Program Year 2018. The changes made to SCSEP performance indicators included a revised definition of a program participant that may result in differences in participant counts and associated costs within quarterly reporting. Therefore, SCSEP will report on these indicators with a caveat of the definitional change.

The Department is highlighting three indicators related to employment and earnings for the purposes of tracking program progress and showing the Department's return on investment. The Department began implementing the new measures December 31, 2017, and collected baseline data for these new indicators in PY 2018. For Employment Rate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter after Exit, the grantees achieved 41.2% nationwide. The PY 2018 performance measure for Employment Rate in the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter after Exit saw grantees achieve 33.1%. Finally, the PY 2018 performance measure for Median Earnings in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter after Exit, grantees achieved \$3,084.

In FY 2018, the cost per participant was \$7,267. This is lower than the cost per position, which is determined by a formula in the SCSEP legislation based on the national average unit cost; including all costs of administration, other participant costs, and participant wage and benefit costs as defined in Section 506(g) of the OAA. It is lower due to the turnover rate. Participant data are derived by using quarterly report estimates.
