- 3. The city of Atlanta is the financial and commercial capital of the Southeast. Printing, publishing, high-technology industries, telecommunications, airline services, military, government services, banking, and insurance are supplemented by industries producing aircraft, beverages, automobiles, electronics and electrical equipment, chemicals, processed foods, and paper products. As shown below, the geographic area to be served encompasses 19 zip code areas within the urban community of Atlanta, Georgia.

4. ATC will serve 80 youth or young adults between the ages of 16-24, in no less than two cohorts of 40 students for 39-months from April 1, 2020, through July 31, 2023.

- 5. ATC does not offer residential housing; therefore, the JCSP@ATC does not include a residential component.
- 6. The funding level requested is \$1,186,900.00.
- 7. The total cost per participant is \$14,836.25.
- ATC is a two-year public community college accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC)
- 9. With an average semester enrollment of 4,800 students. Current data reflects that 91.2% of our students were Pell Grant eligible, which indicates that most of our students served were Job Corps eligible.
- 10. ATC also provides an adult GED program that also serves Job Corps, eligible participants. A list of past personal/career and employment counseling services offered

include providing workshops on resume writing, interviewing skills, and job search to job offer assistance. ATC hosts career fairs to help students and employers connect regarding full-time jobs, part-time positions, and internships.

11. ATC offers 104 programs of study where students can earn a technical certificate of credit, in high demand occupational sectors, in 12-months or less. A partial list is presented below:

12. In summary, ATC shall serve no less than two-cohorts of 40 participants for 39-months,

where a total of 80 participants shall complete two separate tracks of occupational skills training within 12 months. Furthermore, each cohort shall also receive 12-month job placement follow-up services at their point of separation. We will maintain and document direct contact every 30 days during the service period to reassess their needs. Our outcomes include a 90% separation rate, 10% withdrawal/termination rate, 100% qualifying placement rate, 100% placement rate after separation, minimum starting wage \$12.50 hour or \$26,000.00 annually, students will earn on average 30-32 academic credit hours, 3% will enter the armed services, 20% will enter an apprenticeship program, and 77% will be placed in full-time employment.
