PROBLEM TO BE ADDRESSED	Children living in mining communities in Peru are often engaged in small-scale mining activities, including hazardous tasks such as the extraction, transport and crude processing of the mineral ore. Such tasks often expose them to dynamite, mercury and other toxic substances. Many children are unable to attend school, and those who do study in substandard learning environments with few learning materials and unmotivated teachers.
RESULTS	The project withdrew 108 children and prevented 544 children from small-scale traditional mining in the following communities: Ananea, Cerro Lunar and La Rinconada.
PROJECT OBJECTIVES	Development Objective: To reduce the participation of children in the worst forms of child labor in the artisanal gold-mining communities of the province of San Antonio de Putina in the Department of Puno, through the following immediate and sub-immediate objectives:
