<b>PROBLEM TO BE ADDRESSED</b>	The lack of standardized national level data on child labor practices in Brazil.
<b>PROJECT OBJECTIVES</b>	Development Objective: To contribute to the collection of reliable data to support effective interventions against child labor. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• At the end of the program, quantitative and qualitative data on child labor will have been collected, processed, analyzed and disseminated.</li></ul>
<b>SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES</b>	Research Design: Attached a child labor survey as a module to the National Household Survey Sample (PNAD). Socio-demographic and economic characteristics of Brazilians aged ten and above were collected using the PNAD. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Administered a modular household survey to investigate child labor magnitude and practices in Brazil and inform related policy;</li><li>• Utilized data collected to develop national policy papers and IPEC country program priorities; and</li><li>• Repeated longitudinal surveys to maintain time series data on child labor practices.</li></ul>
