The issue is whether the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs properly reduced appellant's compensation benefits based upon the selected position of electromechanical technician.

The Board has given careful consideration to the issue involved, the contentions of the parties on appeal and the entire case record. The Board finds that the decision of the Office hearing representative, dated and finalized August 15, 1997, is in accordance with the facts and the law in this case and hereby adopts the findings and conclusions of the Office's hearing representative.¹
