Our achievements in 2020

Together with a large institutional network, we seek to raise awareness and design public policies to prevent and eradicate child labour in the agricultural sector. This year the coronavirus pandemic did not stop our activity.

We created a board to promote fundamental rights at work in the Argentine Agri-food System.

Along with FAO, the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries, the National Institute of Agricultural Technology, SENASA and the Buenos Aires Central Market.



"Hay Mañana" Campaign

We launched the campaign "Hay Mañana" ("There is a Tomorrow") to foster health, safety and decent work at the Buenos Aires Central Market.

Together with the National Institute of Agricultural Technology we continue doing collaborative research and developing training programmes on Child Labour, Health and Safety at Work, Rural Women and Rural Youth.



As part of the work we do with the **Provincial Commissions for the Elimination of Child Labour**, in Buenos Aires we are committed to develop a geolocalized system for managing and monitoring agricultural child labour.

We supported a campaign on labour rights with the **Ministry of Agricultural Development of the province of Buenos Aires**.



We designed a course addressed to StateTechnical Personnel along with the National Registry of Agricultural Workers and Employers.

We prepared financial education training programmes to strengthen family agriculture with the method of **FINANDES**.

We contributed with the Good Agricultural Practices course of the **Ministry of Agriculture**, **Livestock and Fisheries**.



We acquired more evidence of agricultural child labour thanks to the studies conducted at national and provincial level.
