2. **Count to 10 forwards and backwards**
3. **Name 3 types of work in community**
4. **Day of religious services**
5. **Day of week of birthday, day before that day**
6. **Days of the week forwards and backwards**
7. **Days of week school is open**
8. **Months of year forwards and backwards**
9. **Hours in a day, minutes in an hour**
10. **Light or dark at time X**

What is “input financing”?

**“Input financing” is a type of borrowing that enables farmers to finance agricultural inputs (like fertilizer and pesticides) early in the season, before production revenues are realized.**
