WHEREAS, the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs (OFCCP), recognizes the role of Registered Apprenticeship in expanding opportunities in our workforce that are inclusive of individuals who have been historically underserved, marginalized, and adversely affected by persistent poverty and inequality, thus providing a path for all qualified individuals, including women, people of color, individuals with limited English proficiency, veterans, and individuals with disabilities, to become apprentices and contribute to America's industries; and
