Application Executive Summary

Original Grant:

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is applying for FFY2020 Section 5311 CARES Act funding in the amount of \$73,186,840 to assist the agencies and intercity bus operators in the State of Michigan for the provision of public transportation in the rural area of the state.

The funding will be used for transit operations and capital expenses at 100% federal share. Anticipated short-term activities include COVID-19 emergency response services and wages for employees on paid administrative leave due to service reductions. Subsequent activities will be focused on providing transit services that help the community recover from the severe social and economic impacts of COVID-19. Intercity bus accounts for 15% of Michigan's CARES Act apportionment.

The Program of Projects and a copy of Michigan's DOL Section 5333(b) Warranty are attached to the grant.

MDOT agrees that if it receives Federal funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) or through a pass-through entity through the Robert T. The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is applying for FFY2020 Section 5311 CARES Act funding in the amount of \$73,186,840 to assist the agencies and intercity bus operators in the State of Michigan for the provision of public transportation in the rural area of the state.

The funding will be used for transit operations and capital expenses at 100% federal share. Anticipated short-term activities include COVID-19 emergency response services and wages for employees on paid administrative leave due to service reductions. Subsequent activities will be focused on providing transit services that help the community recover from the severe social and economic impacts of COVID-19. Intercity bus accounts for 15% of Michigan's CARES Act apportionment.
