This application utilizes ARP funding to prevent, prepare for, and respond to Cornavirus. This grant will be used to cover expendiutres relating to operations. Funding Source, FY ARPA funds of \$133,609. There will not be a local funds match. Expenditures include, but are not limited to, Vehicle Insurance, Operating Salaries, Rent, Telephone, Audit and Supplies.

The pandemic has presented an emotional and financial hardship on the Mescalero Apache Tribe. As of June 28, 2021, the Mescalero Apache Tribe's COVID-19 test results were as follows: 17,226 tests were conducted. Of those 16,273 were negative and 953 were positive. There were 25 deaths due to COVID-19. The State of New Mexico remains in a Public Health Emergency. The Mescalero Apache Tribe has an Emergency Communication System for tribal members, via land line. They are able to receive emergency messages to include but not limited to; Health Recommendations, Tribal Information, Severe Weather and more. The Mesalero Apache Tribe sends out a monthly newsletter to its members, called Apache Scout.

The Mescalero Apache Tribe is located in the Sacramento mountains of South Central New Mexico. This mountainous area encompasses four scared mountains, Sierra Blanca, Guadalupe Mountain, Three Sisters Mountain and Oscura Mountain Peak. The reservation has a land mass of 719 square miles. According to the website the Mescalero population is 5,130. Of those, the ethnicity consists of, American Indian 95% and Hispanic or Latino 5%. Approximately 31% of Tribal members live below the federal poverty line.

Public Transportation is an essential service to tribal members, and is provided to the Mescalero Apache Tribe by Ztrans, the local public transportation provider.

Purpose:

The Purpose of this grant is to support the Tribe's Public Transportation endeavors during the COVID-19

pandemic. This will be done through financially supporting part of the Mescalero Apache Tribes share of operating expendiutres. This funding was allocated to the Mescalero Apache Tribe, through ARPA formula funds March 11, 2021. The ARPA, as part of the supplemental appropriations is allocated to support the transit industry during the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Activities to be Performed:

Public Transportation for the Mescalero Apache Tribe will be provided, Monday through Saturday, from 6am to 7:30pm, except on listed holidays.

Expected Outcomes:

By using the ARPA grant funding for expenditures, it will reduce the (638) Road Fund, which Mesclaero is having to use as their subsidy for the service. This will enable the tribe to utilize the (638) road fund on their roads. The ARPA funding will be used for transportation operating expendiutures, beginning October 1, 2021. The ARPA funding will help the Mescalero Apache Tribe subsidize their transportation service. Transportation is provided through the local transportation provider, Zia Therapy Center, Inc. (Ztrans). Zia Therapy Center, Inc. is also Mescalero Apache Tribe's rep, to designated/direct recipient.

Intended Beneficiaries:

Mescalero Apache Tribal member's will reap the benefits by having access to Public Transportation, for Employment, Medical appointments, Grocery shopping, transportation to Secondary Education at, NMSU-A in Alamogordo and NMSU in Las Cruces, New Mexico. Additionally, the tribes infastructure will benefit, as the ARPA grant will alleviate the use of a portion of the (638) Road Fund for the reservations much needed road improvements.

Mescalero Apache Tribe FY 21 ARPA Formula Apportionments.

The ARPA funding will help the Mescalero Apache Tribe subsidize the transportation service being provided by the local transportation provider, Zia Therapy Center, Inc. (Ztrans) in Alamogordo, New Mexico. The ARPA funding will alleviate the Tribe from having to use (638) roads monies, so that it can be used for needed infastructure.

Project Benefits

FY 21 ARPA Formula funding will be used for transportation operating expenses, beginning October 1, 2021 until funds have been exhausted. The benefit is huge, as it will financially reduce the road funds (638) from being used for public transportation and will allow the roads fund to be utilized for roads instead. The ARPA funds are specifically allocated to support the transportation industry during the COVID-19 public health emergency, and this funding will help tremendously. New Mexico is still under a Public Health Emergency.

Additional Information

Public Transportation is essential to tribal members, they use public transportation to get to employment, medical care, grocery shopping and so much more. Transportation allows tribal members to access secondary education, in Alamogordo (NMSU-A) and Las Cruces (NMSU), that otherwise would be inaccessible.

Location Description

The Mescalero Apache Tribe is located in South Central New Mexico and is federally recognized as the "Mescalero Apache Tribe of the Mescalero Apache Reservation". The present reservation was established in 1883. It has a land area of 719 square miles, almost entirely in Otero County. The 463,000 acre reservation lies on the eastern flank of the Sacramento Mountains and borders the Lincoln National Forest, with a small unpopulated section in Lincoln County. The major highway that runs through the reservation is New Mexico State HWY 70.
