Extended Budget Description

Construction of a 120' by 80' building to house transit administration, customer waiting area, light maintenance and vehicle storage on tribal owned property. The project is located along the north side of Indian Affairs (BIA) Highway 10 in Lower Brule, South Dakota, approximately 1,200 feet west of the intersection of BIA 10 and BIA 5. A project location map can be found in the supplemental information.

Construction activities will include: excavation, backfill, grading, surfacing, asphalt approaches, installation of a power slide gate, chain link fence, and sewer/water service extension to accommodate the construction of a 120 foot by 80 foot perimeter building. The building will have on-site parking on the east

side including an handicap accessible parking stall.

An RFP for construction was released in June 2021 and award is anticipated in August 2021.

Federal share is 100%. The useful life of the structure is 40 years, the parking lot's useful life is 20 years and fittings and equipment's useful life is 10 years. Any equipment over \$5,000 will be reported out at grant closeout.
