Specifically, the Pueblo must comply with the ADA Standards for Transportation Facilities when rehabilitating/renovating the bus shelters at the Administrative Transit offices. The following is a non-exhaustive list of ADA standards that the Pueblo must comply with and document compliance of:

- As required under DOT ADA Standard 810.2, the Pueblo must ensure new, altered, or relocated bus stops must have a firm, stable surface and must provide a clear length of 96 inches (2,440 mm), measured perpendicular to the curb or vehicle roadway edge, and a clear width of 60 inches (1,525 mm), measured parallel to the vehicle roadway.
- As required under DOT ADA Standard 810.2, the Pueblo must ensure bus stops must also connect via an accessible route to streets, sidewalks, or pedestrian paths.
- As required under DOT ADA Standard 810.2, the Pueblo must ensure the slope of the bus boarding and alighting area in the direction parallel to the roadway must be the same as that of the roadway to the maximum extent practicable. Perpendicular to the roadway, the slope must not exceed 1:48, that is, not more than 1 inch of rise over a horizontal distance of 48 inches.
- As required under DOT ADA Standard 810.3, the Pueblo must ensure that the minimum clear floor or ground space (as set forth in Section 305) must be entirely within the shelter to accommodate individuals using wheelchairs and must be connected to an accessible route that complies with Section 402 to the boarding and alighting area.

As noted above, these requirements apply to the extent that construction specifications are within the control of public entities; compliance is required to the maximum extent practicable. If a transit agency does not own the right-of way, but another public entity does own it, FTA encourages the transit agency to work with the public entity to come to an arrangement where a bus boarding and alighting area that complies with Section 810.2 to the maximum extent practicable is provided.
