#### **Application Executive Summary**

Amendment #2 - This amendment is to remove two of the original subrecipients that were listed to receive funding - Town of Mills and Casper Area Transportation Coalition (CATC) - as they did not receive CARES Act funding. Also attached is an updated Program of Projects showing the actual expenditures and how the remaining funding will be expended. All awarded funding per each scope remains the same - only the individual amounts awarded to the subrecipients have changed per how the funding was expended. Remaining award funds from the removal of the subrecipient will be utilized by the remaining projects. The Period of Performance is also being extended by an additional year to accommodate the remaining funding.

Amendment #1 - This amendment is to add the remaining portion of CARES Act funding awarded to WYDOT - \$9,871,857 to operating and preventive maintenance activities. With this amendment, the full apportionment (\$22,197,466) will be obligated. Per the CARES Act, the grant requests 100% federal share. This grant utilizes CARES Act funding to prevent, prepare for and respond to COVID-19.

#### Project 1 is revised as follows:

Amendment #2 - From the original listing of subrecipients receiving funding, the following two are being removed as they did not expend any of the CARES Act funding - Town of Mills and Casper Area Transportation Coalition (CATC). With these two removed, 31 transit agencies received CARES Act funding. Amendment #1 - A total of \$9,871,857 in FFY2020 CARES Act Sect 5311 funds is being added to the grant and will be used for operating and preventive maintenance for a total of 33 transit agencies to provide service throughout the state of Wyoming. Federal share is 100%. A Program of Projects is

All transit agencies (30) from the original amendment will have operating and PM subawards extended. With additional CARES funds, it is anticipated that funds may remain beyond FY21; therefore, sub awards will be written to allow expenses through FY22.

Additional CARES Act funds will be used to provide PM for FY21 and FY22 to 33 rural transit agencies who provide transportation in their communities, see POP. In this amendment, 5 additional agencies will receive new PM sub awards, the others will receive additional funds, and the period of performance for sub awards will be extended to cover the period February 1, 2020 through September 30, 2022. Milestone dates will be updated in the next milestone report.

Original Applications - FFY20 CARES Act funds will be used for PM expenses by 28 existing rural transit agencies, including small capital purchases for preventive maintenance and repairs to rolling stock, equipment and facilities.
