Application Executive Summary

This application is to request FY 2022 Section 5311 Tribal Transit Formula funds apportioned to the Quechan Indian Tribe of the Fort Yuma Indian Reservation, Arizona and California, in the amount of \$34,411.

Purpose: The purpose of this application is to assist with operational funds to continue the existing transit service in the Yuma, Arizona region from July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023.

Activities to be performed: The activities will cover the operating expenses of our continuing project, with transit services provided by the Yuma County Intergovernmental Public Transportation Authority (YCIPTA) under a Memorandum of Understanding between YCIPTA and the Tribe.

Expected Outcomes: The outcomes of having this grant application approved will be to continue the existing transit service serving the Quechan Indian Tribe and consisting of a Local Circulator, the Blue Route 5, serving residents of the Fort Yuma Indian Reservation and Winterhaven, California, as well as employees of the Quechan Casino Resort and Paradise Casino. The service also consists of a Regional Connector, the Turquoise Route 10, connecting the Reservation and Winterhaven, California residents with the Imperial County seat, El Centro, California.

Intended Beneficiaries: The benefits of this grant award will improve the Quechan Indian Tribes Tribal Transit Program by continuing to provide reliable transportation service to area transit riders that connect them to employment, shopping, medical; and other transit systems in Yuma and the Imperial County seat in El Centro, California.

The Quechan Indian Tribe (Tribe) will use this funding to continue existing transit services in Eastern Imperial County that it initiated in 2012 - a local circulator and regional connector. The funding will provide funding for a regional connector that connects the Reservation and Winterhaven, California residents and the Imperial County seat, El Centro, California, and the Yuma County seat, Yuma, Arizona. The local circulator - YCAT Blue Route 5, on the Fort Yuma Indian Reservation (Reservation), will continue to serve the Reservation, Winterhaven, and Andrade, California residents, as well as employees of the Quechan Casino Resort and Paradise Casino.

Project Benefits

The continuation of transit services in Eastern Imperial County will continue to maintain the following benefits to Tribal members; access to employment, educational institutions, access to local and regional health services, access to social and recreational opportunities; enhanced efficiencies and effectiveness of Tribal resources; local and regional economic stimulation through both enhanced retail activity and employment; Tribal member professional development through contract administration and performance monitoring. The scope and level of service for the Reservation reflect the small population served and the limited expected demand. The Reservation population is approximately 2,200.

Location Description

The Fort Yuma Indian Reservation, consisting of approximately 45,000 acres, is located in the southwest corner of Imperial County, California. It straddles the Colorado River, turning south towards Baja California (Mexican state), Mexico. The Tribe has jurisdiction over lands within Arizona and California. The project will serve the Reservation in Winterhaven, California, Yuma, Arizona, and El Centro, California.
