Burlington Trailways operates a north/south route on the east side of the state. Jefferson Lines has two north/south routes on the western side of the state. Greyhound is operating a new route using smaller vehicles from Rolla to Columbia on Hwy 63 to St. Louis on I-70 and from Kirksville to Columbia Hwy 63 to St. Louis on I-70, SMTS has taken over the service and vehicles and provides transportation from the Farmington/Park Hills/Potosi area to the St. Louis airport and Greyhound bus station. OATS will be operating routes several routes in the Mid MO, Midwest, Northeast, and Southwest regions of Missouri.

Operating funding for 23 rural public transportation providers includes \$9,058,625 in operating funds used

to subsidize daily operations at 100.00%.
