WisDOT is applying for assistance via FFY 2018 FTA Section 5311 for Department projects and 48 agencies statewide. WisDOT is requesting these funds (\$16,664,130) for rural transit operating (\$9,856,962) and capital cost of contracting (\$2,891,167) assistance, intercity bus capital cost of contracting (\$2,704,180), JARC (\$750,000), and Admin (\$461,821) projects.

WisDOT is also applying for \$200,000 in FFY 2018 Section 5307 funds as part of the Governor's Apportionment for JARC projects in urbanized areas.

WisDOT is also applying for \$453,726 in 5307 and \$46,274 in 5311 funds that were originally awarded through the CMAQ process, and then transferred from FHWA to FTA.

In total, WisDOT is applying for \$17,364,130 in Section 5307 (\$653,726) and 5311 (\$16,710,404) funds.

WisDOT does not own the transit vehicles and engages a third party to operate and maintain the transit vehicles. Pursuant to circular 9030.1E, pages III-13 to III-15, one-half of the total contract for the service (Type 6 contract) that includes contracted maintenance and leased service is eligible for federal capital cost of contracting funds at 80% of the resultant amount. For the period January 1, 2019 - December 31, 2019 WisDOT is projecting a contract expense of \$1,646,328. Therefore the total eligible cost of contracting is one-half of this amount or \$823,164. The allowable federal share is 80% of this or no more than \$658,531. This will be matched with \$174,577 in in-kind match from operating connected unsubsidized route as part of the intercity bus network. Capital cost of contracting covers the depreciation of the vehicles and equipment in addition to maintenance of facility leasing costs.

Jefferson Lines, La Crosse, WI to Milwaukee, WI via Madison, WI (2019 service - STIP to be updated when contracts are set, similar to Wisconsin STIP May 2018 Amendment, pages 36-37)) The service is contracted to a provider using capital cost of contracting. WisDOT does not own the transit vehicles and engages a third party to operate and maintain the transit vehicles. Pursuant to circular 9030.1E, pages III-13 to III-15, one-half of the total contract for the service (Type 6 contract) that includes contracted maintenance and leased service is eligible for federal capital cost of contracting funds at 80% of the resultant amount. For the period January 1, 2019 - December 31, 2019 WisDOT is projecting a contract expense of \$1,143,488. Therefore the total eligible cost of contracting is one-half of this amount or \$571,744. The allowable federal share is 80% of this or no more than \$457,395. This will be matched with \$188,570 in in-kind match from operating a connected unsubsidized route as part of the intercity bus network. Capital cost of contracting covers the depreciation of the vehicles and equipment in addition to maintenance of facility leasing costs.

Lamers Bus Lines, Madison WI, to Wausau, WI (2019 service - STIP to be updated when contracts are set, similar to Wisconsin STIP May 2018 Amendment, pages 36-37))

The service is contracted to a provider using capital cost of contracting. WisDOT does not own the transit vehicles and engages a third party to operate and maintain the transit vehicles. Pursuant to circular 9030.1E, pages III-13 to III-15, one-half of the total contract for the service (Type 6 contract) that includes contracted maintenance and leased service is eligible for federal capital cost of contracting funds at 80% of the resultant amount. For the period January 1, 2019 - December 31, 2019 WisDOT is projecting a contract expense of \$873,225. Therefore the total eligible cost of contracting is one-half of this amount or \$436,613. The allowable federal share is 80% of this or no more than \$349,290. This will be matched with \$165,730, in in-kind match from operating a connected unsubsidized route as part of the intercity bus network. Capital cost of contracting covers the depreciation of the vehicles and equipment in addition to maintenance of facility leasing costs.

The service is contracted to a provider using capital cost of contracting. WisDOT does not own the transit vehicles and engages a third party to operate and maintain the transit vehicles. Pursuant to circular 9030.1E, pages III-13 to III-15, one-half of the total contract for the service (Type 6 contract) that includes contracted maintenance and leased service is eligible for federal capital cost of contracting funds at 80% of the resultant amount. For the period January 1, 2019 - December 31, 2019 WisDOT is projecting a contract expense of \$857,862. Therefore the total eligible cost of contracting is one-half of this amount or \$428,931. The allowable federal share is 80% of this or no more than \$343,145. This will be matched with \$153,925 in in-kind match from operating a connected unsubsidized route as part of the intercity bus network. Capital cost of contracting covers the depreciation of the vehicles and equipment in addition to maintenance of

Extended Budget Description

Operating assistance for four intercity bus routes in calendar year 2019 (STIP to be updated when contract amount is set, similar to Wisconsin STIP Amendment May 2018, pages 36-37). Indian Trails operates two routes: Hurley, WI to Duluth, MN and Escanaba, MI and Milwaukee, WI. Wisconsin Coach Lines operates one route between Janesville, WI and Milwaukee, WI. Lamers Bus Lines operates one route between Madison, WI and Dubuque, IA. WisDOT and Michigan DOT cost-share the Indian Trails route between Escanaba and Milwaukee, with WisDOT providing federal funds and MDOT providing state funds.

In-kind match share for the Indian Trails, Duluth-Hurley (\$263,901), Wisconsin Coach Lines (\$266,840) and Lamers (\$263,402) are provided through unsubsidized intercity bus route mileage. The fourth route, Indian Trails Escanaba-Milwaukee, utilizes \$101,676 in Michigan DOT state funds per a interstate MOU with WisDOT.
