What is **BTMed**?

BTMed provides free medical exams for former DOE construction trades/subcontractor workers.

It is a service program of

CPWR - The Center for Construction Research and Training

CPWR is the construction safety and health research and training arm of North America's Building Trades Unions (NABTU). It was established by NABTU as a nonprofit organization in 1990.



BTMed Overview

Medical Screening Program

- Created in 1996
- Covers construction/trades workers at no cost to the worker
- Covers 35 Department of Energy (DOE) sites
- 44,400 exams
- Initial exam and rescreen exam every 3 years
- Participant Satisfaction of 100%

ELCD (Early Lung Cancer Detection) Program

- Baseline CT Scan, annual CT Scan
- 9,100 CTs administered to 1,884 participants












BTMed Provider Network






Purpose of screening exams:




Why screenings are important

- Identifies work-related health conditions at an early, more treatable stage
 - BTMed results
 - 19.2% abnormal chest x-ray findings
 - 22.6% abnormal pulmonary function test findings
 - 2.2% beryllium sensitivity
 - 64.6% hearing loss
- Contribute to overall health and well-being
- BTMed has saved lives
