**Immediate Objectives** 

Create a comprehensive information system that will incorporate quantitative and qualitative information on child labor to use for policy and program development;

Strengthen the institutional capacity of relevant government institutions to enforce child labor laws and to develop and implement policies and programs to prevent child labor;

Withdraw and rehabilitate 600 children from hazardous work and prevent 300 children from engaging in child labor; and

Affect social attitudes toward children and their educational rights through enhanced awareness of the complex problems associated with child labor.

### **SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES**

- Developed a national information database on child labor and a tracking system to monitor the target group;
- Assisted and trained labor inspectors;
- Organized national workshops to train employers and workers organizations, NGOs, and other key stakeholders about the issue;
- Developed and implemented action programs to withdraw and rehabilitate children engaged in child labor, and to prevent additional children from working;
- Provided economic alternatives to families of formerly working children; and
- Raised awareness among the public and media about the issue of child labor.
