The issue is whether appellant has met her burden of proof in establishing that she sustained an injury in the performance of duty prior to April 7, 1994.

The Board has given careful consideration to the issue involved, the contentions of the parties on appeal, and the entire case record. The Board finds that the February 8, 1996 decision of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs' hearing representative, is in accordance with the facts and the law in this case and hereby adopts the findings and conclusions of the hearing representative.¹
