<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The discrepancies in the medical and factual evidence as to the precise date the alleged lifting incident occurred and the nature of the incident itself, *i.e.*, whether arising from a specific lifting incident or lifting in general, appellant's three- or four-month delay in reporting the incident, and the absence of any rationalized medical evidence establishing appellant sustained a herniated disc arising from the alleged incident justify the Office hearing representative's decision; *see Gene A. McCracken*, 46 ECAB 593, 596-97 (1995).
