MYTH: Employment rates within the disability community are similar to the rates of the general population.

FACT: According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, 17.6 percent of people with disabilities were employed in 2013, compared with 64 percent of people without disabilities.

August 04, 2014 – Executive Order 14.14:

Governor Dayton instructs the State of Minnesota to develop a model for recruitment and hiring strategies to increase the employment of people with disabilities. It also requires all state agencies to develop plans for promoting employment opportunities for Minnesotans with disabilities, and to begin reporting their progress on a quarterly basis.
