General Comment

I strongly support the new policy requiring health-insurance plans to cover birth control without a copay, CMS-9992-IFC2. Thank you for this important improvement to women's health care.

I also want you to know that I am concerned that certain religious employers may be allowed to opt out of the requirements. All women should have access to contraceptive coverage, regardless of where they work.

To prevent this would be discriminatory. To allow religious employers to impose their lifestyle choices on others is discriminatory. Both violate the foundation on which this country was founded.

This policy finally should make near-universal access to birth control a reality for all women who use it. Regardless of employers religious or political views.
