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## **General Comment**

Please allow me to express my concern over new government regulations that force some employers to pay for health care services that violate their religious convictions.

I refer specifically to the new mandate from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services that will require nearly all health insurance providers to fully cover birth control and abortion-inducing drugs.

I understand soaring health care costs are a serious problem, and that some changes are needed in how these costs are borne. I also understand religious views concerning birth control vary.

Nevertheless, liberty of conscience and religious expression remain foundational to American freedoms. Encroachments upon these liberties – even subtle threats such as the kind presented by the new federal health care laws – undermine essential values all Americans hold dear.
