I am a Family Physician in New Braunfels, Texas and the Chair of the Family Medicine Section of the Christian Medical and Dental Association. I object to the contraceptive mandate in the rules and regulations under the new PPACA.

I believe that it's okay to use real contraceptives – the kind that don't kill anyone. I'm also cautiously convinced that Plan B doesn't prevent implantation. (See "Plan B, How It Works and Doesn't Work"

However, I have real concerns that "EllaOne" might interfere due to its effect of lowering progesterone, even in post-ovulatory women, and I know that the IntraUterine Device (IUD), when placed early in the pregnancy works to prevent implantation.

I am also concerned that many of my colleagues who have moral objections to contraception will be unable to continue in practice.

The life of each of us begins at fertilization: any *in vitro* fertilization lab tech can tell the difference between an embryo and an unfertilized egg.
