The proposed project will also expand upon existing partnerships to create training programs for incumbent workers wanting to upskill for health care occupations addressing the opioid crisis.
Service Strategies	The strategy plans to strengthen and supplement support services to the reentering citizen population, which has a high rate of substance abuse and addiction. The project plans to provide additional funding for life skills and career pathways, and also reduce recidivism. The project will expand upon the success of the Alaska workforce system and its established partnerships, which has mainly included the apprenticeship work-based-learning model. In addition, it will build on the already expansive and effective addiction treatment programs, upskilling the current training providers, as well as increasing their availability throughout the state.
