<b>Project Description</b>	This project creates disaster relief employment for eligible individuals to assist with the clean-up and recovery efforts resulting from severe winter storms affecting the northern half of the State from January 3 through January 12, 2017. These storms generated three declarations from FEMA: <i>California Severe Winter Storms, Flooding, and Mudslides</i> ; <i>Hoopa Valley Tribe Severe Winter Storm</i> ; and <i>the California Potential Failure of the Emergency Spillway at Lake Oroville Dam</i> .
