Project Service Area	The proposed funding would provide reemployment services for individuals in the New Hampshire communities impacted by the health and economic effects of widespread opioid use, addiction, and overdose.
Target Group	The grant may provide services to dislocated workers, new entrants to the workforce, and incumbent workers (currently employed or underemployed), who are directly or indirectly affected by economic and workforce impacts resulting from the opioid crisis.
Project Description	This grant will provide career, training, and supportive services for eligible individuals in the New Hampshire communities impacted by the health and economic effects of widespread opioid use, addiction, and overdose.
Service Strategies	The primary goal of the project is to utilize a unique combination of training and work-based learning models that build on or enhance existing community efforts, to address the opioid epidemic. The project will encompass a refined approach to services that builds on intensive upfront counseling, job-search and barrier resolution activities with wrap-around support services tailored to the customer's needs. Career and training services will be aligned with services provided by other partners. These services will include assessments and work readiness activities, ensuring that they are delivered for the best possible outcomes to participants, at the most opportune time for success, and avoiding duplication.
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
