

### Qualifying Events

The January storms produced torrential rain and snow that caused flooding; mudslides; downed trees and power lines; and the evacuation of thousands of residents.



### Proposal Summary

The California Employment Development Department has submitted to the Department of Labor an application for \$36,000,000 in Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), Title I, Section 170, National Dislocated Worker Grant (DWG) funds. The purpose of the request is to create disaster relief employment for eligible individuals to assist with clean-up and recovery efforts resulting from severe winter storms affecting the northern half of the State.



### Project Description

This project will create disaster relief employment for about 1,800 eligible individuals to assist with the clean-up and recovery efforts resulting from severe winter storms affecting the northern half of the State. These storms generated three declarations from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA): California Severe Winter Storms, Flooding, and Mudslides (FEMA-DR-4301); Hoopa Valley Tribe Severe Winter Storm (FEMA-DR-4302); and the California Potential Failure of the Emergency Spillway at Lake Oroville Dam (FEMA-EM-3381).
