Economic Transition Factors

Workers at all skill levels face constant churn from the "creative destruction" caused by the pursuit of innovation. This extreme dislocation activity is occurring even while the unemployment rate in the region is tied for the lowest in the state at 2.4% (July 2018). The dislocations are not so much isolated events, but rather the effect of systemic churn with the workforce.



Proposal Summary

California's LWDA, in conjunction with the EDD's staff, will assess and determine which career pathway is a suitable match for each participant. If it is determined that the participant is in need of upgrade skills training, then the staff will utilize the Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL) to ensure that the course of study aligns with a high demand occupation.
