

Qualifying Events

Hurricane Florence hit North Carolina on September 14, 2018. The storm brought record amounts of rainfall and flooding to coastal counties. The storm received a major disaster declaration from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), under the North Carolina Hurricane Florence, DR-4393.



Proposal Summary

The North Carolina Department of Commerce submitted an application requesting \$18,500,000 in Disaster Recovery National Dislocated Worker Grant (DWG) funding. The funding will allow the state to begin the creation of disaster relief employment for approximately 925 eligible individuals to assist with clean-up efforts in 18 coastal counties.



Project Description

The Employment and Training Administration approved DWG funding of up to \$18,500,000, with an initial amount of \$9,109,181 awarded initially. The clean-up will assist in 18 counties.
