While lowa exceeded its performance goals in all areas, there was a significant increase in layoffs across the state since March 2024. Iowa continues to review participation number for the

Dislocated Worker program and provide technical assistance to local workforce development areas to increase participant numbers after a closing or layoff has occurred in the local area.

to job openings and low unemployment numbers in lowa those being laid off have been able to connect to employment without additional assistance form the Dislocated Worker program. It should

also be noted that enrollments continue to be down which can be attributed to the realignment of four local areas into one effective 7/1/2023 that covers half the state. The realignment resulted in the loss of service provider staff leading up to the transition and the hiring and training of new staff during the transition period leading to a lack of outreach and follow-up with enrolled participants. lowa's focus for program year 2024 is ongoing training on data integrity, the accurate recording of performance outcomes, career planning, outreach, and follow-up.
