Due to funding amount, and it being a pilot program, WIOA enrolled a few youths for the duration of the program. On The Job Training began June 2023 and ended on April 5, 2024. Youths were trained in employability skills for no more than 30 hours per week during school breaks through out the year. There were two sets of youth, ISY and OSY. Both sets of youth also participated in Peer to Peer counseling by a local youth group called Bangikoi Society.
