ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:

Below is a summary of the State of Washington's PIRL submission:

- 4,994 total errors were addressed with hardcoded values, in order to pass WIPS edit checks successfully.
 - 2,510 total records were either hardcoded with a value of zero in "Wagner-Peyser", when they were co-enrolled with another program and did not receive a Career Service or "Most Recent Date Received Career Service" was populated with "Date of Program Entry" when they were only enrolled in "Wagner-Peyser".
 - 1,583 total records were hardcoded with a value of zero, where the "Highest School Grade Completed" was unavailable.
 - 689 total records were hardcoded with the "School Status at Program Entry" status, where the "School Status at Exit" status was unavailable.
 - 105 total records were hardcoded to remove "Category of Assessment" when the pre-test wasn't present.
 - 82 unique records were hardcoded, in order to pass various other WIPS edit checks successfully.
- The PY23Q4 PIRL was recertified with refreshed out of state wage data (SWIS), which was missing in the original certification for PY23Q4.
- Washington is still working to correctly populate Element 401. Proxy data has been given to participants that were not served by RESEA. This will be addressed in the PY24Q1 certification.
