**SUBJECT:** Extension of Period of Performance for Awards related to Grant Opportunity

Announced in Unemployment Insurance Program Letter (UIPL) No. 23-21

1. <u>Purpose</u>. To advise states that the period of performance for awards that promote equitable access to unemployment compensation (UC) programs is extended to March 31, 2024.

**2.** <u>Action Requested.</u> The U.S. Department of Labor's (Department) Employment and Training Administration (ETA) requests that State Workforce Agency Administrators provide information contained in this UIPL to appropriate staff.

## 3. Summary and Background.

a. Summary – On August 17, 2021, the Department issued UIPL No. 23-21 advising states of the availability of funding for activities that promote equitable access to UC programs. In that UIPL, states were advised that grant applications should be submitted no later than October 18, 2021. The Department determined that states needed additional time to submit such applications, and extended the deadline to November 30, 2021, in UIPL No. 23-21, Change 1, issued on November 1, 2021. In response to state requests for more time, the Department further extended the deadline for submitting these grant applications to December 31, 2021 in UIPL No. 23-21, Change 2, issued on December 20, 2021.

The Department is providing feedback and technical assistance to states on a rolling basis to help them not only meet the requirements for approval described in the funding opportunity announcement, but also to help ensure their proposed projects and activities are likely to have successful outcomes and potentially become best practices. As a result of the time this process requires, states have requested an extension of the period of performance for this funding opportunity. The Department is announcing an extension of the period of performance and that UI equity grant funds must be obligated by states by March 31, 2024, and liquidated within 90 days thereafter.

- b. Background On March 11, 2021, the President signed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) into law (Public Law (Pub. L.) 117-2). Section 9032, ARPA, creates a new Section 2118 of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act (Pub. L. 116-136) and provides a \$2,000,000,000 appropriation to the Secretary of Labor to detect and prevent fraud, to promote equitable access, and to ensure timely payment of benefits to eligible workers with respect to UC programs. In support of ARPA's goals, the Department issued UIPL No. 23-21, announcing a grant opportunity for activities that promote equitable access to UC programs. Section 6.b. noted that UI equity grant funds must be obligated by states by September 30, 2023, and liquidated within 90 days thereafter. *See* section 4.b. of UIPL No. 23-21 for information on allowable uses for such funds to promote equitable access to UC programs.
- **4.** Guidance. Section 6.a. of UIPL No. 23-21 sets out the required actions that states must complete in applying for a grant under this offering. Based on feedback from multiple applicants, the Department determined that states may need additional time to revise their applications as well as to perform their proposed projects and activities. Therefore, the Department is amending Section 6.b. of UIPL No. 23-21 and is extending the period of performance for this opportunity to March 31, 2024. The section now reads:

**Timeframe for Obligation and Liquidation of Funds**. These UI equity grant funds must be obligated by states by March 31, 2024, and liquidated within 90 days thereafter. Funding for state staff may not be obligated for use at a future date and the obligation may only occur at the time the staff performs services on the project.

Other than this extension of the period of performance and the above-mentioned extensions of the deadline to submit grant applications, announced in UIPL Nos. 23-21, Change 1 and Change 2, all other guidance and information in UIPL No. 23-21 remain the same. Thus, states with an approved UI equity grant application may request a modification extending the period of performance for their grant activities.
