Amendment One

Pay-for-Performance Incentive Payments Program

AGENCY: Employment and Training Administration, Department of Labor

ACTION: Amendment to FOA-ETA-26-19

SUMMARY: The U.S. Department of Labor, announced on February 13, 2026, the availability of funding for the Pay-for-Performance Incentive Payments Program to be awarded through a competitive process.

The document is hereby amended as follows:

Section III.B Program Goals and Objectives

The following is added:

Under this FOA, lead applicants are responsible for providing incentive payments to eligible RA program sponsors. Lead applicants, and any other organizations responsible for decision-making or administration of the award are ineligible to, and will not receive, incentive payments. However, required or optional partners of the lead applicant that are not involved in decision-making or administration of the award can be eligible to receive incentive payments with the appropriate safeguards in place. Applicants must maintain separation between RA program sponsors receiving incentive payments and any decision-making related to incentive payment disbursements so that all decisions related to incentive payment disbursements remain objective and impartial. As noted in Section II.C. of the FOA: Post-award, there will be an initial implementation period lasting up to 120 days during which the Department will collaborate with awardees to provide feedback on the incentive plan, ensure the plan explains how the entity will maintain separation between RA program sponsors receiving incentive payments and any decision-making related to incentive payment disbursements, and approve a final incentive plan for implementation.
