A training and awareness-raising method to prevent and eradicate child labor and its worst forms, based on the methodology of popular education and cascade training.



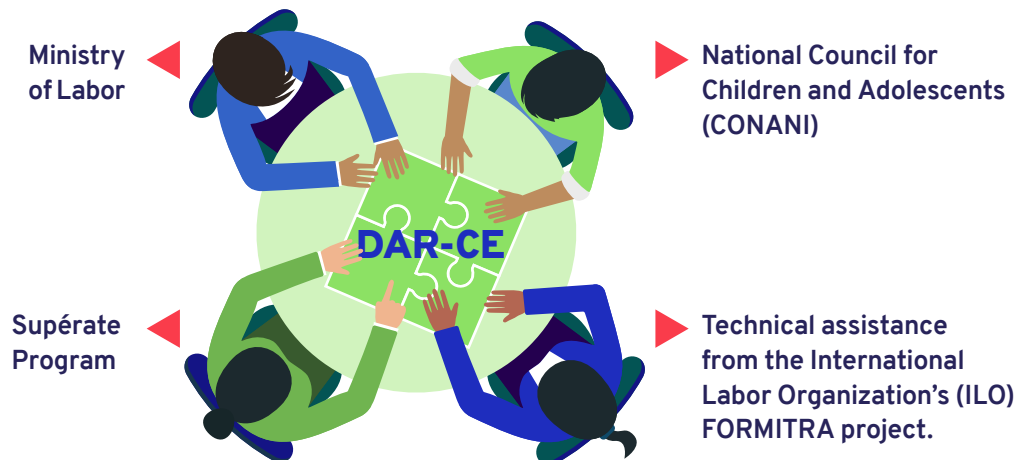
▶ Stages

The DAR-CE method gets its name from the acronym formed by the verbs of the five stages in which it is developed:

-  **DESCRIBE** each participant's reality.
-  **ANALYZE** and identify beliefs, attitudes and practices.
-  **REFLECT** on lessons learned from the fulfillment of rights.
-  **COMMIT**, visualize and design how we would like our reality to be in order to change.
-  **EVALUATE** commitments made, and return to reality.

Inter-institutional Construction and Coordination

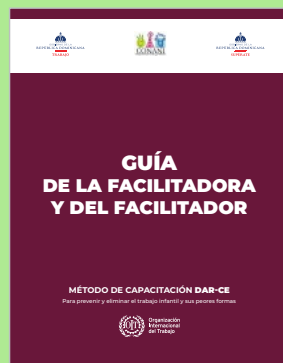
Through an inter-institutional working group, a training guide on child labor was developed over the course of almost a year.



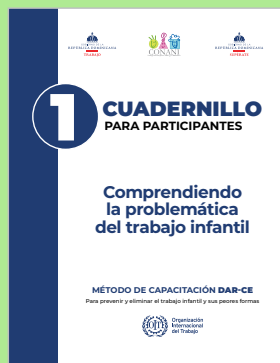
