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### 1. Introduction

This documentation describes the data collected and used for the Randomized Controlled Trial Impact Evaluation of the Young Potential Development Program (YPD) in Ecuador conducted by IMPAQ International for the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of International Labor Affairs (ILAB). This study was funded by the Office of Child Labor, Forced Labor and Human Trafficking (OCFT) as part of the Closing the Child Labor and Forced Labor Evidence Gap: Impact Evaluations. The purpose of the study was to provide causal estimates from an experimental evaluation of the effects of the YPD program on child labor reduction. IMPAQ used survey data from adolescent program participants and school administrative records and estimated the impact of YPD on hazardous child labor and related labor outcomes, socio-emotional skills, education and other outcomes.

Results from the study are summarized in Gulemetova et al. (2019)<sup>1</sup> and were based on information from the following sources:

- Student Survey
- School Administrative Records

The public use survey data files for the study are 'Survey Data – Ecuador\_Public Use.dta', which contains 676 records and 'Admin Data – Ecuador\_Public Use', which contains 726 records. Each data file has a single record for each student who participated in the study during the 2016-17 school year. The data is organized by school and classroom. Unique students are clustered in classrooms within seven municipal schools in Quito. Gulemetova et al. (2019) describe the study design and set up in detail.

## 2. Information about Input Data Sources

#### 2.1 OVERVIEW

Below is a description of the two sources of data used in the evaluation. In both datasets any variable from baseline has a b\_ prefix while any variable from endline has an e\_ prefix.

#### 2.2 DATA FROM STUDENT SURVEY

The bulk of the evaluation uses data from the student survey. The survey includes information on demographics, socio-emotional skills, home activities and employment, and students' social activities. It was administered at baseline (2016) and at follow-up (2017) in the study participating schools. Students are connected across datasets using the studentid variable. All variable labels and value labels have been translated into English with the exception of specific responses given to open-ended questions. Raw variables include a  $b_v$  or  $e_v$  prefix and then a number corresponding to a question in the survey. Raw variables used in the analysis are recoded for usability – for example, non-responses coded as 99 are recoded to missing.

#### 2.3 SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE RECORDS

School administrative data was collected from Quito Secretariat of Education at follow-up (2017) to determine students' graduation status, final grades, behavior marks, and attendance rate. These outcome variables were merged with demographic information from the baseline student survey using the unique studentid variable.

#### 2.4 DESCRIPTION OF DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE RESTRICTED AND PUBLIC VERSIONS

To protect the identity of individuals, all personally identifiable information has been stripped from the public-use datasets ('Survey Data – Ecuador\_Public Use.dta' and 'Admin Data – Ecuador\_Public Use.dta'). In some instances, variables with fewer than five observations in a given category have been masked by aggregating their categories into broader ones to minimize the risk of identification.<sup>2</sup> For example, hazardous occupations with fewer than five responses are grouped together into one variable (b\_v29\_masked and e\_v15\_masked). Continuous variables such as household size or income have also been masked to hide values at the low and high ends, which could potentially identify an individual. Exhibit 1 lists the variables that are excluded from or masked in the public-use data file (and therefore from the data dictionary), along with the rationale for excluding or masking each variable.
