**ORDER DENYING MOTION TO CERTIFY ORDER
FOR IMMEDIATE APPEAL**

This matter arises under Executive Order 11246 (30 Fed.Reg. 12319), as amended, and associated regulations at 41 C.F.R. Chapter 60. It is currently set for hearing in San Francisco, California, on June 26, 2018.

On August 31, 2017, the court held a telephonic hearing with respect to Defendant's Motion to Certify for Immediate Appeal to the Administrative Review Board this Court's Order Regarding the Temporal Scope of the Litigation. Attorneys Warrington S. Parker, III, and Andrew Silverman appeared for Defendant, while Attorneys Laura C. Bremer and Ian H. Eliasoph appeared for Plaintiff.

Defendant filed its moving papers with the court on August 28, 2017, after conferring telephonically with opposing counsel, but not with the court. Plaintiff has filed opposition to the Motion and Defendant, by letter dated August 29, 2017, and hand-delivered to the court, has replied to the opposition.

The court summarily denies the motion under the terms of its Order issued May 10, 2017, which prohibits any party from filing any motion without first conferring with opposing counsel and the court. Additionally, the court has reviewed the transcript of the hearing held in this matter on May 9, 2017, at which the court likewise instructed the parties not to file any motion without first conferring with opposing counsel and with the court. In both the May 9, 2017, hearing and in the

Order issued May 10, 2017, the court indicated it would summarily deny any motion filed in derogation of that procedure.
