

Department of Labor Conference Report Fiscal Year 2025

In FY 2025, DOL continued its conference review process involving the Office of the Chief Financial Officer, the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Administration and Management, and the Office of the Solicitor. For FY25, DOL incurred around \$890,000 in costs to the Department for conferences.

Throughout the year, DOL hosted a variety of conferences and trainings ranging from grantee trainings to agency leadership meetings which were designed to set the stage for the agency's significant initiatives for the next fiscal year, including organizational and management goals that are critical for the agency's successful implementation of its strategic plan.

Department of Labor Conferences over \$100,000 in costs to the Department

Explanation: The purpose of the in-person convening was to bring together 82 Apprenticeship Building America (ABA) grantees and offer a range of modalities, beyond existing virtual training and technical assistance offered throughout the year, to guide grantees in building and implementing workplans to meet performance outcomes. Grantees engaged in peer exchanges, built and strengthened relationships with Industry Intermediaries and Registered Apprenticeship Technical Assistance Centers of Excellence, and received expert consultations to inform their strategic action planning for grant implementation. The convening provided a deeper dive into the core components and requirements of the ABA program and applied technical assistance provided virtually throughout the year into actionable and sustainable takeaways.
