Application Executive Summary

This grant will utilize \$398,549 in FY21 CRRSAA funds at 100% federal share to complete the engineering, design, and construction of the Oneida Transit bus garage. The Oneida Nation will construct a new transit garage that consists of office space, vehicle storage, wash bay and mezzanines to accommodate the Transit Department's space needs. The new facility will be built on a 3-acre site, including exterior hard surfaces and green space. The new facility will be approximately 12,660 square feet total, with the office portion approximately 3,700 square feet, and the vehicle bay area approximately 8,960 square feet. The vehicle bay area will be large enough to house the entire transit fleet and provide adequate storage space for vehicle supplies and parts. The facility is designed to be functional, ADA compliant, expandable, and energy efficient in order to minimize operating costs and offer sustainable design features.

In addition to FTA's Buy America requirements under 49 U.S.C. 5323(j) and 49 CFR Part 661, which require that the steel, iron, and manufactured goods used in an FTA-funded project are produced in the United States, the Build America, Buy America Act (BABA) (Public Law 117-58, div. The project will complete the engineering, design, and construction of the Oneida Transit bus garage. The new facility will be built on a 3-acre site, including exterior hard surfaces and green space. The new facility will be approximately 12,660 square feet total, with the office portion approximately 3,700 square feet, and the vehicle bay area approximately 8,960 square feet.

This grant funding will cover the following construction activities:

Earthwork activities to develop site, stormwater management features, new underground utilities to structure, sidewalks, asphalt parking lot, parking lot lighting, and dumpster enclosure;

Office area which consists of a fully adhered THPO membrane roof structural framing, stone veneer, aluminum siding, storefront entrance and a wrap-around awning. The spaces included in the office area: offices, waiting area, conference room, reception area, restrooms, breakroom, data closet, and storage rooms;

Vehicle Storage Area which consists of a pre-engineered metal building structure, pre-finished metal roof

and wall panels, simple saver system, in-floor heat, and equipment mezzanine. These spaces are included in the Vehicle Storage area: various vehicle bays, office area, mechanical rooms, and wash bay.

- Door access control
- Fire alarm system
- Network cabling
- · Materials used are modern, aesthetically pleasing and energy efficient.
- Surveillance System
- Vehicle Washing Equipment
