The employer does not ensure that flexible cords and cables are not used as a substitute for the fixed wiring of a structure.

a) This most recently occurred on or about December 1, 2022, throughout the salesfloor of Dollar General Store No. 22944, located at 607 East Highland Drive in Oconto Falls, Wisconsin. The employer exposes employees to electrical fire and shock hazards when metal outlet boxes are suspended by flexible cords above the retail floor, providing power to various coolers and lights throughout the store.

Dollar General Corporation was previously cited under the name Dolgencorp, LLC dba Dollar General Store #4495 for a REPEAT - OTHER violation of this occupational safety and health standard 1910.305(g)(1)(iv)(A), which was contained in OSHA inspection number 1455672, citation number 1, item number 2, and was affirmed as final order on May 13, 2020, with respect to a workplace located at 40976 AL 77 South, Ashland, AL 36251.

To abate this hazard in the future, the employer must ensure they install appropriate permanent wiring in the structure and do not use flexible cords in lieu of such wiring.

If the debt remains delinquent for more than 90 calendar days, a delinquent charge of six percent (6%) per annum will be assessed accruing from the date that the debt became delinquent.

Administrative Costs: Agencies of the Department of Labor are required to assess additional charges for the recovery of delinquent debts. These additional charges are administrative costs incurred by the Agency in its attempt to collect an unpaid debt. Administrative costs will be assessed for demand letters sent in an attempt to collect the unpaid debt.
