Frequently Asked Questions

The following questions are for stakeholders who have questions concerning the mandate that all federal agencies will <u>discontinue accepting payment of debt by paper check</u>. (Executive Order 14247).

Question: Who is affected by this Executive Order?

• Answer: Everyone obligated to pay assessment bills, penalties (33 U.S.C. §§ 914g, 930e), §944c 1 compensation orders, and refunds for improper payments.

Question: What does the Executive Order - Modernizing Payments To and From America's Bank Account entail?

• Answer: This initiative requires that, to the extent permitted by law, all payments made to the Federal Government must be processed electronically.

Question: When does the Executive Order become effective?

Answer: All federal agencies must comply by September 30, 2025.

Question: Why is the government implementing this initiative?

Answer: Collection of payment electronically promotes operational efficiency and reliability. Conversely,
payment by paper check increases delay in payments; and results in potential fraud, lost payments, theft,
and inefficiencies. Thus, the initiative aims to promote the security of financial transactions.

Question: How can we issue payments to the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs (OWCP)?

- Answer: Acceptable payment methods include:
 - o Pay.gov Form Service
 - ACH Credit
 - o Fedwire

Question: Are there other payment methods available besides Pay.gov, ACH Credit, or Fedwire?

• Answer: Currently, no other methods are available. OWCP is collaborating with intra-agency partners to explore additional electronic collection options.

Question: Can we currently pay our assessment by paper check?

 Answer: Pursuant to Executive Order 14247, OWCP has been directed to collect payments issued to the federal government only electronically.
