## Description of Event Types

### **JOTG Town Hall Meeting**

The Joint Outreach Task Group (JOTG) is made up of the Division of Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation (DEEOIC) and partner agencies that play a role in the administration of the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program Act (EEOICPA). These agencies include the Department of Energy (DOE) and their former worker medical screening programs, the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), the Department of Justice (DOJ) Radiation Exposure Compensation Act (RECA) Program, and the Offices of the Ombudsman for the EEOICPA and NIOSH. JOTG outreach events start with informational presentations given by DEEOIC and JOTG agencies. DEEOIC provides an overview of the EEOICPA presentation, and another presentation covering medical benefits. The Office of the Ombudsman for the EEOICPA provides a presentation covering the services they provide and helpful tips for claimants. NIOSH provides a presentation on the dose reconstruction and special exposure cohort petition processes. DOE provides a presentation on records, and their former worker medical screening programs provide information on free medical screenings for former workers at DOE nuclear weapons sites. After the presentations, there is a question-and-answer session with all presenters, and the agencies meet with the public at tables situated throughout the venue. Throughout the events, DEEOIC and DEEOIC Resource Center employees are available to meet with claimants individually to assist with case status updates, medical benefits issues, and claims filing assistance.

### **Energy Outreach Event**

Energy outreach events are staffed by DEEOIC Resource Center employees, Claims Examiners (CE), Medical Benefits Examiners (MBE), and DEEOIC National Office staff. The Resource Center staff setup an information and registration table at the entrance to the venue. DEEOIC brochures are placed on the tables. Resource Center staff interact with attendees to answer general questions about the program. There will be a private area for Resource Center Caseworkers to intake new claims and CEs/MBEs to provide case status updates, answer case specific questions, and troubleshoot medical benefits issues. These events may include information tables from other Joint Outreach Task Group (JOTG) agencies.

### **Traveling Resource Center**

These events are typically hosted near covered facilities and manned by DEEOIC Resource Center employees. The purpose of the events is to provide Resource Center services and information to stakeholders who are not located near one of the eleven Resource Center locations. Resource Center staff setup registration tables at the entrance to the venue. DEEOIC brochures are placed on the

tables. Resource Center staff interact with attendees to answer general questions about the program. There will also be a private area where Resource Center Caseworkers will have tables setup to meet with attendees individually and intake new claims or answer questions about existing claims and medical benefits issues. Any questions or issues beyond the scope of Caseworker assistance will be referred to DEEOIC staff.
