

Division of Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation (DEEOIC)

The Site Exposure Matrices (SEM) website has been updated! This update makes the website current through May 15, 2026. New information is now available for five U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) sites, including significant additions to two of these sites.

The significant changes involved in this release include:

- GE Ohio (Evendale) - Clarifying Administrative Staff and Administrative Support labor categories. Added Administrative Support labor category aliases Operator, computer and Clerk, computer operations. Added eight work processes and twenty-four toxins.
- Separations Process Research Unit (Knolls Atomic Power Laboratory) – Added Security Police Officer activities. Added seven buildings, six work processes, and fourteen toxins.

DOL received eight Internet Accessible SEM (IAS) website public submittals related to five toxic substances and three disease inputs since the last update on November 16, 2025. None of the eight IAS submittals resulted in SEM profile revisions.

Since the SEM first became available to the public in March 2010, there have been 31 revisions of the SEM website. Prior to the release of each new version, DOE reviews the new and revised information to ensure that no classification issues exist.
