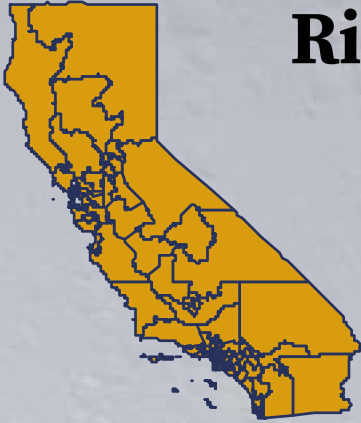

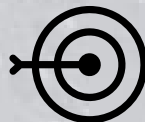
Project Overview

The project plans to serve individuals from historically-marginalized communities or groups and individuals who have been unemployed for an extended period of time or who have exhausted UI or other Pandemic Unemployment Insurance Programs. The grantee will prioritize service delivery to African American, Asian-Pacific Islanders, and Latinx communities.



Project Description

The project plans to provide participants with career and training activities for reemployment, and supportive services including English Learner support, child care, and transportation; create and execute an outreach campaigns to include flyers, social media, and television; and organize and maintain strategic partnerships with community organizations to identify and enroll participants.



Project Goals

The goal of the project is to enable participants from the City of Richmond and the surrounding region who have lost employment as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, to obtain and retain high-quality family sustaining-wage employment in multiple ways.
