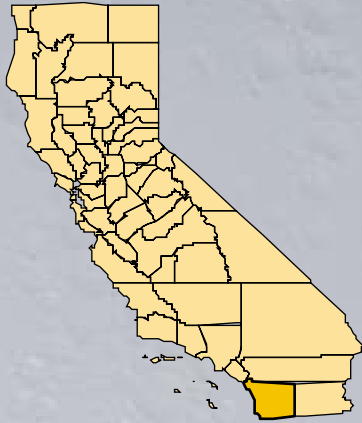

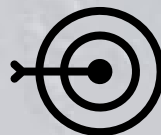
Project Overview

The project plans to serve individuals from historically-marginalized communities or groups. The grantee will prioritize service delivery to Alaska Native/American Indians.



Project Description

The project plans to provide participants with supportive services and training, including internships and apprenticeship programs, to move into higher paying career paths; expand virtual technology applications; create and execute outreach campaigns to priority populations including veterans; and organize and maintain strategic partnerships to optimize use of resources and co-enroll participants.



Project Goals

The goal of this project is to provide long-term unemployed opportunities for employment in living wage jobs. Able-Disable Advocacy is offering training that will lead to industry credentials and employment in high-wage occupations. Another goal is to reduce local dependence on foreign workers by training Americans to fill technology positions.
