LABOR FORCE STATISTICS OF VETERANS WITH DISABILITIES

FACTSHEET

This document from the Current Population summarizes labor force statistics from government programs for veteran survey and program participation for select federal government programs for veterans¹ with disabilities^{2,3}.

Labor Force Statistics

Populations, Labor Force Participation, Employment, and Unemployment Rate in 2023

- ▶ In 2023, there were 17.8M veterans in the civilian, non-institutionalized population. Of those, 5.2M (30%) reported having a service-connected disability and 4.6M (26%) as having a disability. In comparison, there were 239.8M nonveterans and of those, 28.5M nonveterans (12% of all nonveterans) reported having a disability.
- ▶ There were 8.6M veterans (48.2% of all veterans) in the labor force and 8.4M were employed. Of the veterans in the labor force 2.6M (30.2%) reported as having a service-connected disability and 991,000 veterans (11.5%) reported a disability. For the 156M nonveterans in the labor force, 7.1M (4.5%) reported having a disability.
- ▶ The unemployment rate for veterans persons with a disability (4.8%) was lower than non-veterans persons with a disability (7.4%) and veterans with a service-connected disability (6.0%), yet higher than all veterans (2.8%).

Trends from 2019 to 2023

- ▶ From 2021 to 2023, the number of veterans persons with a disability in the labor force increased by 177K and service-connected disabled veterans in the labor force increased by nearly 327K.
- ▶ The unemployment rate for veterans persons with a disability decreased from 10.5% in 2020 to 4.8% in 2023.

¹ In the CPS, veterans are defined as men and women who previously served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces and who were civilians at the time they were surveyed. Veteran status is obtained from responses to the question, "Did you ever serve on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces?"

² Presence of service-connected disability is determined by answers to two questions beginning in August 2021: "Have you filed a claim for or received a rating from the Department of Veterans Affairs or the Department of Defense confirming that you have a service-connected disability; that is, a health condition or impairment caused or made worse by military service?" and (asked of those who said yes) "Did you receive a VA disability rating?"

³ For non-service-connected disabilities, the CPS uses a set of six questions to identify persons with disabilities, which includes a physical, mental, or emotional conditions that cause serious difficulty with their daily activities. A response of "yes" to any one of the questions indicates that the person in question has a disability.

- From Program Year (PY) 2018 to PY 2022, the ratio of Jobs for Veterans State Grants (JVSG) funded Disabled Veteran Outreach Program (DVOP) assistance to specialist-served "Disabled Veterans" compared to "All Veterans," increased from 63% to 77% (PY 2018 PY 2020), declined to 61% in PY 2021 and remained at 61% in PY 2022.
- ▶ From PY 2019 to PY 2022, the ratio of American Job Centers (AJC) and JVSG DVOP-served "Disabled Veterans" to "All Veterans," increased from 20% to 23%.

From Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 to FY 2021, the "New" to "Total" veteran participant ratio in the Veteran Readiness & Employment (VR&E) program increased from 24% to 36%, declined to 29% in FY 2022, and remained at 29% in FY 2023.
