## ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

On July 28, 2022 appellant filed an appeal from a September 10, 2019 merit decision of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs (OWCP). The Clerk of the Appellate Boards assigned Docket No. 22-1153.

The Board has duly considered the matter and notes that the Board has jurisdiction to review final adverse decisions of OWCP issued under the Federal Employees' Compensation Act.<sup>1</sup> For final adverse decisions of OWCP issued on or after November 19, 2008, the Board's review authority is limited to appeals which are filed within 180 days from the date of issuance of OWCP's decision.<sup>2</sup>

The 180<sup>th</sup> day following the September 10, 2019 decision was March 8, 2020. As appellant did not file an appeal with the Board until July 28, 2022, more than 180 days after the September 10, 2019 OWCP decision, the Board finds that the appeal docketed as No. 22-1153 is untimely filed. The Board is without jurisdiction to review the appeal. Appellant has not offered

a reason to explain the failure to timely file an appeal with supporting documentation sufficient to establish compelling circumstances. Because there is no final adverse decision issued by OWCP within 180 days of the filing of the instant appeal, the Board concludes that the appeal docketed as No. 22-1153, must be dismissed.<sup>3</sup> Accordingly,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT the appeal docketed as No. 22-1153 is dismissed.
