## **ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL**

On May 1, 2023 appellant filed an appeal from a February 5, 2018 merit decision of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs (OWCP). The Clerk of the Appellate Boards assigned Docket No. 23-0794.

The Board has duly considered the matter and notes that the Board has jurisdiction to review final adverse decisions of OWCP issued under the Federal Employees' Compensation Act.<sup>1</sup> For final adverse decisions of OWCP issued on or after November 19, 2008, the Board's review authority is limited to appeals which are filed within 180 days from the date of issuance of OWCP's decision.<sup>2</sup>

The 180<sup>th</sup> day following the February 5, 2018 decision was August 4, 2018. As appellant did not file an appeal with the Board until May 1, 2023, more than 180 days after the February 5, 2018 OWCP decision, the Board finds that the appeal docketed as No. 23-0794 is untimely filed. The Board is without jurisdiction to review the appeal. Appellant has not explained his failure to

timely file an appeal with supporting documentation sufficient to establish compelling circumstances. Because there is no final adverse decision issued by OWCP within 180 days of the filing of the instant appeal, the Board concludes that the appeal docketed as No. 23-0794, must be dismissed.<sup>3</sup> Accordingly,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT the appeal docketed as No. 23-0794 is dismissed.
