ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

On August 28, 2023 appellant sought an appeal from a purported final adverse March 1, 2023 decision of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs (OWCP). The Clerk of the Appellate Boards assigned the appeal Docket No. 23-1126.

The Board, having duly considered the matter, notes that the Board has jurisdiction to review final adverse decisions of OWCP issued under the Federal Employees' Compensation Act. ¹ This jurisdiction encompasses any final decision issued by OWCP within 180 days of the date appellant filed his appeal. ² The case record as transmitted to the Board does not contain a final adverse decision of OWCP issued within 180 days from the date of docketing of the current appeal over which the Board may properly exercise jurisdiction. ³ The March 1, 2023 OWCP decision was not a final adverse decision as OWCP vacated an October 13, 2022 decision, which reduced appellant's wage-loss compensation, effective September 2, 2022. It also expanded the acceptance

of appellant's claim to include cervical radiculopathy. As there is no final adverse decision issued by OWCP over which the Board may properly exercise jurisdiction, the Board concludes that the appeal docketed as No. 23-1126 must be dismissed.⁴ Accordingly,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT the appeal docketed as No. 23-1126 is dismissed.
